WR **Aaron Boone** continues to pose problems for defenses. He's taller at 6'2" than many DBs; he is also deployed from all receiver positions (mostly slot) and is Ragone's go-to guy.

**Keys to Winning:** What Berlin needs to do is plug the hole in the middle of the defense. Even without Hamden and Donald, Smith and Payton make the offense go because of game-breaking ability; in turn, it makes the passing game all that more effective. If Berlin can shut down Payton and Smith, they have an easier path to victory. Kittner has been scatter-armed this year. His cage can be rattled, so if Berlin can get Amsterdam into throwing situations it could be a different game.

Amsterdam has to account for one player on offense - the versatile **Aaron Boone**. Boone is the one player defenses have trouble with. He's Ragone's go-to-guy. One thing Berlin does better than anyone is mix and match personnel with a variety of formations. If Amsterdam is going to win, they have to not take the bait and play it straight up - take away RB **Cal Murray's** running lanes, pressure Ragone and account for Boone.
