Aaron Boone voted into All League Team Ragone is League Offensive MVP

Aaron Boone was selected to this year's All League team, another honor for him in his banner year at Berlin in the NFL Europe. He joined QB Dave Ragone, who was also the league offensive MVP, Rich Scanlon, the league defensive MVP, and four other Berlin team members. The players are selected to the All League Team by NFL EL Coaching Staffs, media and fans who voted at nfl-europe.com.

Aaron finished the regular season as the leading receiver in the league. He also led the league in Special Teams tackles.

A comment about Aaron Boone from FOX Sports commentator Eric Money Penny:

Finishing the day with 6 catches for 81 yards and a touchdown, Boone is the standout of the Berlin receiving corps. I don't like labeling people as "possession receivers" but Boone has been very adept this season at finding open spaces in the defense 10 to 15 yards downfield, and plays like a much bigger target than his 6-2, 207 pound frame.

A comment about Aaron Boone from gridline.com:

Aaron Boone on his return to Berlin, has had a spectacular season. Last season he shared the spotlight and this year he was the focus, and played injured the last half of the season. With Carolina in need of receiver help, Boone should fit in fine.

Dave Ragone is the most efficient passer in the league. The stats aren't fancy and they didn't need to be. Ragone is the best field general in the league, solid on bootlegs, and is adept at finding his third and fourth options. Boosting the passing game was WR **Robert Redd**, a former high school teammate of Ragone's. Redd compliments speed burner **Michael Jennings** and **the indispensable Aaron Boone**. Boone's strength are short routes - hitches, slants and drags. He's been known to break a few off of quick slants. Amsterdam has an underrated defensive line and one that can put heat on an opposition.
